

# Cries of Freedom the Musical 2016

## *Frequently Asked Questions*

### 1. What is the show about?

Cries of Freedom presents people's cries and struggles to free themselves from tyranny and from the rule of the King of England through music, dance and drama. The presentation is for all religions, ages and cultures.

### 2. When is it?

2016 performance dates are: July 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th  
Times 10:00 am 2:00 pm 6:00 pm each performance day

### 3. Where is Cries of Freedom performed?

The Cries of Freedom stage is erected each year on the west side of Scera Park in Orem 600 South State Street, Orem, Utah (just north of the Scera swimming pool). It is also part of the ongoing event called the Walk of Freedom

### 4. Where do we park?

Parking is available on side streets surrounding the park. In addition there is parking at the Scera Elementary School located at 400 East and 400 South, Orem Utah

5. What seating is available? There are no reserved seats. There will be chairs provided on a first come, first served basis. You may also bring a blanket or lawn chair if you wish to sit on the free grass space.

6. Where should someone with a walker or wheelchair sit? You may sit anywhere in the general seating area as long as you do not block the isles or sit in areas that have been taped.

7. How long is the performance? The performance runs about 65 to 70 minutes

### 8. Is it appropriate for children? How young?

The performance is appropriate for children. It is very colorful and fast moving with lots of action. During the show children from the audience are invited to the stage area to ride with Paul Revere. There is also a blanket area in the front of the chairs for children so they can see better.

### 9. Who is this production sponsored by?

Roots of Freedom, Provo's Freedom Festival, Orem Care Tax and Scera Center for the Arts.

10. Who are the participants in the production?

Most of our actors are young people age 12 - 25. We also have a few younger children age 4 - 8, and a few older adults.

11. How much are the tickets and where do we get them?

Admission is free and no tickets are required. This production, a celebration of freedom, is our gift to the community.

12. Will donations be solicited?

Donation jars can be found throughout the event. All donations are appreciated!

13. Can we bring food?

Yes, you are free to bring a modest picnic dinner to eat at your seats while you wait for the show to begin. Or you may wish to eat on the grass outside of the performance area and/or throughout the park. There will be concession stands for those who wish to purchase their food at the event. To keep our park beautiful we ask that you clean up after yourselves.
